It was moved by Eric Dany and TJ Regul to have the club purchase a number of cards to be sent to members or relatives of members at appropriate moments in their lives, such as illness or death.

Finally, as arranged by his wife, there was a brief birthday celebration for Tom Montgomery on his 70th.

November is our annual teach-in in which four teachers each teach us one magic trick. Our teachers were Joe Dobson, Kim Meacham, Chuck Hanson, and Bob Beardsley.

<u>Joe Dobson</u> taught a <u>Larry Hass</u> trick, 'One Card, and One Card Only' aka 'Fine Nine Steps.' A volunteer pulls out a packet of cards from the center of a borrowed deck, learns the face card, replaces the packet, and shuffles the deck. The deck is then spread face up, and 3-7 cards are removed by the volunteer, including the glimpsed card. The magician now divines the chosen card. Seemingly impossible!

<u>Kim Meacham</u> presented <u>Dean Dill's</u> 'No Extras,' which is a version of Matrix involving only the four half dollars and 'no extra' coins as in the usual methods. And, it is fairly easy.

<u>Chuck Hanson</u> picked a coin from a handful of coins, held it in his closed fist, and sent out a psychic vibe as to whether the coin was heads or tails up. After guessing, it was shown that neither guess was correct, since the coin had disappeared. Incredibly easy misdirection!

Finally, <u>Bob Beardsley</u> taught us three quick tricks – a coin move in which a coin is being continuously plucked from the air and transferred to the other hand; the poor man's handcuffs with rubber bands; and a silk knotted on a rope which is merely plucked from the rope after adding an 'invisible hole' to the rope. All good moves!

Altogether, a rather good variety of tricks – thanks, guys.
